## ***Updates and Work in Progress:***

- Pilot-testing the first week of the Early Clinical Experience's Blood Pressure Concerns topic took place April 29 through May 8, 2016.


We utilized JustInTimeMedicine for preparatory and assessment experiences and piloted the anatomy Lab session, the Team-Based Learning session, two Post Clinic Group sessions, the physiology Lab, and the Simulation session. We also led the students through the newly-ratified Student Manual for Assessment and Promotion for their input and feedback.

Students are evaluating every part of that pilot, as are the faculty who participated, both in teaching as well as in their role as simulated "students." We learned a great deal, and more and more sessions will be piloted in coming weeks. Thanks to everyone who prepared, planned and participated!!!

- The College of Human Medicine Student Manual for Assessment and Promotion (the CHM Student MAP) has been ratified and College bylaws adjusted for the new processes and structures.
